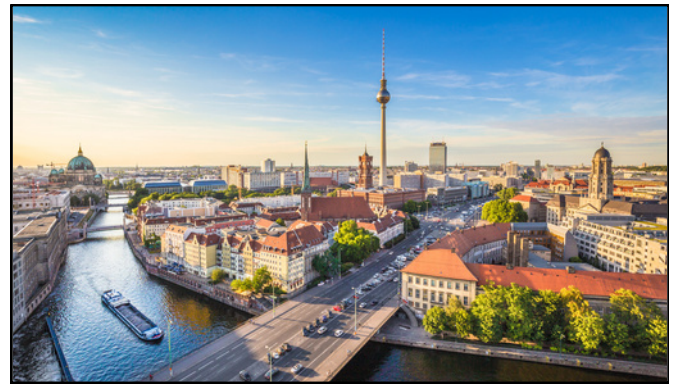

ITINERARY

Day 1: Wednesday, Sept. 10, 2025: Depart

We will depart from the USA. Group flights will be available from Chicago, or alternative flights can be requested. **(IF)**

Day 2: Thursday, Sept. 11, 2025: Arrive in Berlin

Welcome to Germany! On arrival in Berlin, we will transfer to our luxury hotel for a relaxing two-night stay, as part of the CLEF special package. The afternoon we will acquaint ourselves of the city on a relaxing River Cruise, followed by leisure time. Dinner tonight is in the hotel. **(IF/D)**

Day 3: Friday, Sept. 12, 2025: Potsdam, Berlin

After a delicious breakfast, our private guide will pick us up at the hotel for a guided tour of Potsdam, a UNESCO World Heritage site, with stunning palaces, beautiful gardens, and fascinating history. We will visit Sanssouci Palace, the summer palace of Frederick the Great, King of Prussia. We will also see the Dutch Quarter, a charming neighborhood with 134 Dutch brick buildings, the "Bridge of Spies", the Peace Church and the Russian quarter. The evening is at leisure. Alternative tours can be arranged for today on request. **(B)**





Day 4: Saturday, Sept. 13, 2025: Berlin, Wittenberg

After our exclusive two-day CLEF tour, we will meet up with other tour participants for a panoramic sightseeing tour of the reunified German capital, highlighting the Reichstag (parliament building), the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, the refurbished city center, and Gendarmenmarkt. We will also see Alexanderplatz, the famous boulevard “Unter den Linden,” and the Berlin Cathedral. We will continue to Lutherstadt-Wittenberg and check-in. We will dine in our hotel this evening, then go to the weekly Wittenberg English Ministry service. **(B/D)**

Day 5: Sunday, Sept. 14: Wittenberg

We will have a free morning to attend a church service or have free time. After lunch, we will take a tour of Lutherstadt Wittenberg. It was here in 1517 that Martin Luther nailed his famous 95 Theses to the door of Castle Church (Schlosskirche). Although the original doors were destroyed in the Seven Years War, we can see Luther’s texts cast in bronze on the new doors. We will visit St. Mary’s Church, where Luther regularly preached, and visit the Old Latin School next door. Luther’s former home, the Lutherhalle, is now a Reformation Museum, and we will see where he lived with his family (if it’s reopened), as well as some of Luther’s very own personal library, rare manuscripts and early Bibles. We can arrange for a time of fellowship today with the Wittenberg English Ministry. The rest of the day will be free to explore independently. **(B)**

Day 6: Monday, Sept. 15: Eisleben, Gotha

This morning we will drive to Eisleben, where Luther was born and also where he died. It is sometimes referred to as his “Bethlehem and Jerusalem”. We will visit both of these homes, as well as St. Anne’s, an old miner’s church famous for the Biblical Scenes hewn in stone. St. Peter and St. Paul Church is where Luther was baptized, and St. Andrews is where he preached his last sermon. In the afternoon, we will continue on to Gotha (via Stottenheim) and dine together. **(B/D)**

Day 7: Tuesday, Sept. 16: Erfurt, Gotha

We will begin our day visiting the Augustinian Monastery in Gotha, where Luther stayed in 1515 and 1516. He preached here on his way to the Diet of Worms. The onsite café employs people with disabilities, who will be delighted to serve you. We will continue on to Erfurt for a walking tour, including St. Mary's Cathedral, Church of St. Severus, and the famous Merchant's Bridge. We will also tour the Augustinian Monastery, where Luther became a monk on July 17, 1505. We will be able to see his monastic quarters, including one cell furnished to look as it would have when he lived there. We will end the day with a group meal in the Augustiner Restaurant before returning to Gotha. **(B/D)**



Day 8: Wednesday, Sept. 17: Eisenach, Gotha

In 1521, while fleeing from the wrath of the Pope, Luther took refuge in the Wartburg Castle after a fake kidnapping staged by his friend and protector, Frederick the Wise. We will tour the Wartburg and see where Luther finished translating the New Testament into German in just eleven weeks. We will have free time in Eisenach to visit the Bach House, Luther House and St. George's Church. We will return to Gotha in the late afternoon. **(B/D)**



Day 9: Thursday, Sept. 18: Rothenburg-ob-der-Tauber

We will drive down to Rothenburg this morning, the most picturesque and well-preserved of the towns along the famous "Romantic Road". It is one of Germany's very best walled medieval cities – most of the buildings were built by 1400. Our walking tour of the town will include St Jacob's Church and the City walls. After an early dinner, we will join the Night Watchman Tour on his nightly rounds. **(B/D)**

Day 10: Friday, Sept.19: Heidelberg

Today we will visit Heidelberg, a city with a fascinating history. The Heidelberg Confession was drafted by Zacharius Ursinus (age 28) and Caspar Olevianus (age 26). After free time for lunch, we will visit Heidelberg Castle which boasts the world's largest wine barrel, and a stunning view. The evening is at leisure. **(B)**



Day 11: Saturday, Sept. 20: Worms, Mainz (World Children's Day)

In Worms, we will tour the Cathedral, followed by the site of Luther's Worms Debates (Diet of Worms), now a park, with a plaque commemorating Luther's brave stand for faith and truth in 1521. We'll have a photo stop at the stunning Reformation Monument and visit the Church of the Holy Trinity. In Mainz, we will tour the Gutenberg Museum exhibits in the Natural History Museum, which celebrates the work of Johannes Gutenberg, who invented book printing with movable letters. This led to the media revolution and the spread of Reformation teaching. We will have dinner with wine-tasting this evening. **(B/D)**

Day 12: Sunday, Sept. 21: Frankfurt, Mainz

We will attend Sunday morning service at Trinity Lutheran in Frankfurt, where Rev. Bob Flohrs served as pastor for many years. This is an English-speaking congregation. We will have lunch, with some invited members of the congregation (plan for 4). We will enjoy a leisurely Rhine Cruise in the afternoon before returning to our hotel. The evening is at leisure. **(B/L)**

Day 13: Monday, Sept. 22: Return

We will transfer to Frankfurt Airport for our flights back to the USA. **(B/D)**
